2. APPROVAL OF MINUTES

2.a 10/01/24 EAB Draft Meeting Minutes

Rebecca Paschal motioned to approve October 1st, 2024, minutes, and Andrew Wickes seconded. All in favor.

3. C.O.R.E. UPDATE

- Jake introduced the new CORE representative, Jamie Vott. Moving forward Jamie will represent CORE at the EAB meetings.
- CORE has reviewed and is completing an early design review of the Draw Site housing project as it relates to energy efficiency.
- A funding request has been submitted to the Town for approval and what the scope of work will include
- Currently assisting Anderson Ranch, Snowmass Chapel, and Timberline on moving toward electrification

5. ITEMS FOR DISCUSSION

5.a Wildfire Mitigation Update from RFFR

The Roaring Fork Fire Department is making significant strides in wildfire mitigation efforts, entering its tenth year of crucial projects. John Mele outlined the department's ongoing work, which includes:

- Removing hazardous trees
- Creating fuel breaks (Clumping)
- Clearing brush along trails

These measures reduce fire hazards and create space to slow fire progression.

In 2024, the Town of Snowmass contributed \$100,000 to support these efforts. To further assist, John urged the EAB to continue advocating for funding allocation to the council. The EAB's support and advocacy for these vital projects are crucial in safeguarding our community from the increasing threat of wildfire.

5.b Presentation from 106 West

Kolby and Dave outlined their business plan for “First and Last Mile Micromobility Solutions”. They talked through how it is working in other mountain communities and how it could potentially work in Snowmass. Points to consider for it to be viable in Snowmass Village

- The warehouse and charging docks for trucks need to be within a 3 mile radius of the businesses for it to operate efficiently.
- Where would this location be? Base Village Garage, Two Creeks?
- Would the Town consider allocating funds to offset the cost?
- Vendors using the docking station would pay a fee

The board unanimously agreed they would like to continue this discussion and see if there is a way it could be applied in Snowmass.

Andrew will contact East West and follow up with the possibility of using Base Village Loading dock and 106 West will develop a more thorough plan for how it could work in Snowmass.
